



Across

- 7 muscle originating from the tip of the coracoid process & inserted into the middle third of the humerus (16)
- 9 The biceps inserted distally through this structure (9,11)
- 11 Nerve supply to the extensor compartment of the arm (6)
- 12 Part of the humerus which articulates with the head of the radius (9)

- 15 Region of the upper limb between the shoulder and the elbow (3)
- 16 process: Lower insertion of the triceps (9)
- 18 Number of muscles in the arm (4)
- 19 muscle of the posterior compartment of the arm (7)
- 20 Nerve: Pierces the medial intermuscular septum to enter the posterior compartment (5)

- 21 Nerve which lies lateral to the brachial artery in the arm (6)

- 1 The most distal muscle in the forearm (10)
- 2 Action of the brachialis (7)
- 3 Number of branches of the ulna nerve in the forearm (4)
- 4 Nerve supply to the muscles of the flexor compartment of the arm (16)
- 5 Artery in the radial groove of the humerus (9,7)
- 6 head

- originates from the posterior surface of humerus, inferior to radial groove (6)
- 8 Bone of the arm (7)
- 10 Part of the humerus which articulates with the ulna (9)
- 13 Number of compartments in the arm (3)
- 14 Common flexor origin on the distal humerus (6,10)
- 17 head originates from the posterior surface of humerus, superior to radial groove (7)
