- 4 The cords are named according to their position relative to the artery. (8)
- 5 Number of branches from the root of the brachial plexus (3)
- 6 Nerve of the posterior compartments of the upper limb (6)
- 9 The only trunk of the brachial plexus that gives rise to branches (5)

- 12 Second part of the brachial plexus (5)
- **13** Anterior divisions of the upper and middle trunks unite to form the cord (7)
- 14 The lowerscapular nerve suplies this muscle and the subscapularis (5,5)
- 16 Which cord is formed by the union of the three divisions of the trunks (9)
- **18** Ventral rami of C7 continues as this (6)

- **19** Terminal part of the lateral cord (16)
- **21** Terminal part of the brachial plexus (6)

- 1 The terminal branch of the medial cord (4)
- 2 Number of branches from the posterior cord (5)
- 3 Anterior divisions supply Muscles (6)
- 7 The only branch from the lateral cord (7,8)

- 8 Muscle supplied by the Upper Scapula Nerve (13)
- **10** Nerve originating from C5,5,6 roots of the brachial plexus (4,8)
- 11 Third part of the brachial plexus (8)
- **15** First part of the brachial plexus (4)
- **17** The only nerve that receives contributions from both the lateral and medial cords (6)
- 20 Fourth part of the brachial plexus (4)
